Dear Church Family,

Thanksgiving was established as a national holiday in the United States by President Abraham Lincoln in 1863. The roots of the holiday can be traced back to 1621, when the Pilgrims offered a prayer of thanks before their meal with members of the Wampanoag Tribe. The Pilgrims were grateful for their first harvest in the New World—and for their Native American neighbors who helped make it possible. The momentous occasion is often referred to as “the first Thanksgiving.”

That would likely come as a surprise to certain Bible characters who gave thanks to God thousands of years before the Pilgrims arrived in the New World. They demonstrated the kind of gratitude that pleases God—and perhaps inspires others.


One of the pinnacles of King David’s reign was the arrival of the ark of the covenant—God’s dwelling place among His people—in Jerusalem. David was so grateful to the Lord for allowing the ark to be transported to Jerusalem that he could barely contain himself. Second Samuel 6:14 says he “danced before the Lord with all his might.” Two verses later, he’s described as “leaping and whirling before the Lord.” His display of thankfulness was so exuberant that his wife chided him for celebrating in a manner unbecoming a king. David refused to let her spoil his thanksgiving.

Jesus was passing through a village in Samaria when He encountered a group of ten men who suffered from leprosy. The men cried out for Jesus to have mercy on them. Jesus heard their cries and healed them. He instructed the men to show themselves to the local priests so that they could be ceremonially cleansed. The men did as they were instructed, and then nine of them went their separate ways. Perhaps they left to celebrate their healing. Perhaps they intended to share the good news with their loved ones. Perhaps they were just eager to rejoin society and begin their new lives. The tenth leper likely had similar plans. But he had something else to do first. According to Luke 17:15-16, he “returned, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on his face at [Jesus’] feet, giving Him thanks.” Jesus was moved by the man’s response, which must have been almost as rewarding to the man as the healing itself. Because he went the extra mile to express his thankfulness, the tenth leper was able to connect with the Lord in a profound way.

Anna's Picks!!



Senior Ministries



2019 marks the 28th year that Congregational Presbyterian Church will be participating in the Angel Tree program of ministering to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of children who have a parent incarcerated in a State or Federal prison. It is the love of Jesus Christ, *that baby in a manger*, that we see reflected through joyful, great-hearted giving on behalf of Angel Tree, the ministry that gives us an opportunity to help meet the needs of families of prisoners.

We again begin our year-long process of connecting parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts. Each child receives two wrapped gifts: one new toy or fun gift, and one new article of clothing, each with a \$20-\$25 value. I hope that we can again take the program one step further by purchasing a gift certificate from a local supermarket or department store for each of the caregivers.

Not only do we bring Christmas gifts to every household, but Sherry Greenup also ministers to each of our Angel Tree families by preparing beautiful food baskets. We will once again follow through in 2020 with Easter Baskets and birthday gifts for our Angel Tree children. We've been known to send kids to Camp Spalding as well!

The Angel Tree adorned with children's gift selections will be in Fellowship Hall... November 24th & December 1st.

Select an angel and then shop for your gifts.

All wrapped gifts must be returned to the church by Sunday, December 15th, to allow plenty of time for delivery before Christmas.

Watch for further reminders as Christmas approaches!

We have not as yet been able to make personal contact with all families who have been assigned to our church, so we cannot tell you the exact number of Angels we will be serving this year.

We need your help and prayers to assist us in filling these children's needs, as well as prayers for all the caregivers and inmates.

CHICKEN SOUP WITH PEANUT BUTTER

Ruth Benson's Recipe and may be found in our church cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 2 onions, chopped and browned
- 1 c. peanut butter
- 1 small can of tomato paste
- 3 to 4 carrots, very finely chopped
- 1 green pepper, finely chopped
- 1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. chili powder
- 1/2 tsp. (or less) salt or Mrs. Dash
- 6 c. chicken broth, divided (4 c. and 2 c.)
- 4 c. chopped cooked chicken
- 1 can cream of chicken or cream of celery soup



INSTRUCTIONS

Heat together the onions, peanut butter, tomato paste, cayenne pepper, black pepper, chili powder, salt, and 2 cups of chicken broth, then add the cooked chicken, the remaining 4 cups chicken broth, and the green peppers. Bring to a boil and simmer for 2 hours. One hour before serving, add 1 can of cream of chicken or cream of celery soup; mix and continue cooling for the last hour. Serves 6.




