The way God designed our bodies is a model for understanding our lives together as a church: every part dependent on every other part, the parts we mention and the parts we don't, the parts we see and the parts we don't. If one part hurts, every other part is involved in the hurt, and in the healing. If one part flourishes, every other part enters into the exuberance. You are Christ's body — that's who you are! You must never forget this. Only as you accept your part of that body does your 'part' mean anything." - 1 Corinthians 12:13, 25-27 (The Message)

This spring our sermon series has been making its way through Paul's first letter to the believers in Corinth. The first three Sundays in March we will examine chapters 12, 13 and 14 where Paul focuses on unity in the body of Christ in the midst of the diversity that exists in the church. Comparing the body of Christ with the human body, he says that we are many parts and the differences between the parts can lead to problems.

Yes, we "parts" sometimes wound each other, ignore each other, and chafe each other. But we also warm each other, heal each other, and support each other. We truly are better together. I'd like to share with you three reasons each one of us needs to be a "part" in the body of Christ.

First, the body encourages us when we need it most. At church we come face to face with others who are seeking to be faithful followers of Jesus Christ while dealing with the ups and downs of their daily lives. We soon realize that none of us is living the Christian life perfectly, but we do sense that these fellow disciples take it seriously – and, so do we.

Second, the body protects us from going it alone. One of our culture's defining values is so-called "rugged individualism." From movies to advertisements to folk stories, we love tales of those who've succeeded against all odds on their own. From its very first chapters, however, the Bible favors relationship over individualism. In Genesis 2:18 God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone."

Third, the body needs your participation. All of us have been divinely wired with a unique set of experiences, passions, spiritual gifts, and skills. These make us unlike anyone else, which is why you have the unique potential to benefit our congregation. Come join your "part" with the rest of us "parts" that together as one body we may serve the Lord.

### **NOW AVAILABLE: CPC Fund College Scholarship Applications**

Through the generosity of former and current members and friends of our congregation, a trust fund has been established for the purpose of furthering educational opportunities for members of our congregation and others who **are or have been** involved in the life and ministry of our church. The trust fund yields an annual interest which is used by our CPC Fund Ministry to award scholarships to students. The CPC ministry is excited to announce that the applications for our college scholarship are now available. The CPC Fund Ministry has set the following guidelines:

- 1.) The recipient must be a member of our congregation and/or active in the Congregational-Presbyterian Church youth program at the **present time or previously**, if now in college or going back to school.
- 2.) The award is renewable *upon application*, for a **maximum of four years**, toward certification or an associate, bachelor or graduate degree.
- 3.) Awards will be given to:
  - \*Those graduating from high school and going on to college
  - \*Current undergraduate and graduate students
  - \*Those in vocational training
  - \*Those in career changes

The applications will be sent out to students who have been active in our youth ministries. Applications are also available at the Welcome Center and in the office.

Applications will be taken from now until May 1, 2020

### Diane Ashburn Wilmonen Scholarship

Applications are available in Fellowship Hall for the Diane Ashburn Wilmonen scholarship. "God is using me to tell others about Jesus," Diane said of her 7-year journey with breast cancer. In August, 2002, her family and friends celebrated her life at Congregational Presbyterian church by establishing a college scholarship for a first time or returning college student who is a member or friend of the church. This year's scholarship will be for \$1200.00. The deadline for the application is April 1, 2020 with the scholarship awarded on Mother's Day, May 10, 2020. 

## March Pick!

In the small north Florida town of Seabrook, a young lawyer named Keith Russo was shot dead at his desk as he worked late one night. The killer left no clues behind. There were no witnesses, no real suspects, no one with a motive. The police soon settled on Quincy Miller, a young black man who was once a client of Russo's.



Quincy was framed, convicted, and sent to prison for life. For twenty-two years he languished in prison with no lawyer, no advocate on the outside. Then he wrote a letter to Guardian Ministries, a small innocence group founded by a lawyer/minister named Cullen Post.

Guardian handles only a few innocence cases at a time, and Post is its only investigator. He travels the South fighting wrongful convictions and taking cases no one else will touch. With Quincy Miller, though, he gets far more than he bargained for. Powerful, ruthless people murdered Keith Russo, and they do not want Quincy exonerated.

They killed one lawyer twenty-two years ago, and they will kill another one without a second thought.







A note from Kathy: This is my favorite recipe to take to our staff brunches. It originally came from Beth Chase, one of the best cooks I ever met. Enjoy!

### <u>INGREDIENTS</u>

2 C cubed ham

I can Cream of Chicken Soup

IC sour cream

I C shredded cheddar cheese

1/2 large onion, chopped

l – 30 oz pkg. frozen shredded hashbrowns, thawed

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp pepper

Combine soup, sour cream, cheese, onion, salt & pepper. Add ham. With paper towels, pat hashbrowns dry. Stir into soup mixture. Transfer to a greased 13x9 pan. Cover and bake at 350 for 1 hour. Uncover and bake another 15 minutes.

### New Women's Bible Study: Listen, Love, Repeat Tuesdays, March 10th through April 14th 12–1pm in the Administration Office Conference Room

### About the study:

In this six-session video Bible study Karen Ehman, New York Times bestselling author, helps you rediscover the life-changing joy that comes from putting others first. In a culture that tells us a me-first, you-second way of living is the key to happiness, Ehman explains that the key to moving forward in almost every facet of your life is to embrace backward living.

Becoming a person who thinks about others first takes effort. It requires you to live alert. To be on the lookout in conversations for "heart drops"--hints of kindness you might grant to the person right in front of you, right where they are.

But it is worth it.

Listen, Love, Repeat gives you both the encouragement and practical, daily ways you can reach out to others with both planned and random acts of kindness. Topics include loving your family and friends, encouraging coworkers, reaching out to the lonely, blessing the "necessary people" who help you get life done every day but often go unnoticed, and many others who could use an act of thoughtfulness. An additional focus on modeling for your children a lifestyle that listens and loves is accompanied by doable ideas for you and for your family.
