ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP SERVICE

FEBRUARY 17th, 6:00 PM

In the Sanctuary

(the service will be live-streamed)

The 40-day season of Lent, which this year begins on February 17th (Ash Wednesday) and ends on April 3 (the day before Easter), is a season of spiritual preparation for the Easter Sunday celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. (For those of you who are getting out your calendars and counting the 40 days, Sundays are not included.)

We invite you to attend our Ash Wednesday Worship Service at the church. This

is an opportunity to begin the 40 days of Lent with prayer, music, meditation, and the proclamation of God's Word. (Note: *MidWeek* will not meet on February 17th. Child care is provided during the Worship Service.)



Dear Church Family,

The 40-day season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 17) and ends on April 3, the day before Easter Sunday, and serves as a time of preparation for celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. A good way to observe Lent is by means of the discipline of daily reading God's Word. One way of doing so is through our Congregational Bible Reading Plan, available on our website, www.congopres.org.

The goal of reading the Bible is to get a fresh look at the things of God, and especially to get a fresh look at Jesus. The core of the faith for the Christian believer is explored as we seek to answer two fundamental questions: who was this Jesus spoken of in the Bible and what does he have to do with us? The Bible claims that through Jesus, God has revealed himself to human beings. "No one has ever seen God, but God's only Son, who is at the Father's side, has made him known" (John 1:18).

Holy Scripture has the power to bring people to faith in Jesus Christ. Those who are willing to give it an honest reading will experience the compelling nature of God's Word. That is because "the word of God is living and active" (Hebrews 4:12). Those who spend time meditating on the Scriptures will experience the passages coming to life. Through the text we see something about ourselves or something that is going on in our world, and we receive insight into how to respond.

The Holy Spirit is the one who draws people to God. The Bible is like any other writing in its physical form, words that in themselves are simply human expression. These words tell everyone that they have sinned (Romans 3:23), but many do not believe that to be true. The Bible declares that we are separated from God and need to be made righteous before him (Romans 3:10), and that there is a coming judgment of human beings (Hebrews 9:27), but people do not believe this simply because they read it in a book. It is the work of the Holy Spirit, through the Scriptures, to "convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment" (John 16:8).

I would like to invite you to attend the Ash Wednesday Worship Service in our Sanctuary at 6:00pm on February 17. This is an opportunity to prepare ourselves for the 40 days of Lent through prayer, music, and the proclamation of God's Word. The service will be live-streamed on our website.



Valentine's Day Strawberry Muffins

Ingredients:

- I tablespoon lemon juice
- I cup milk
- 1/2 cup butter, at room temperature
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 4 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons lemon extract
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1 1/2 cups chopped fresh strawberries
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- I teaspoon baking powder
- I/2 teaspoon baking soda
- I/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup miniature semisweet chocolate chips
- 12 slices fresh strawberry
- I tablespoon white sugar

Directions:



- Mix lemon juice with as much milk as needed to measure I aup; let the soured milk stand for 5 minutes before using.
- Preheat an oven to 350 degrees
- Line 24 muffin tins with paper liners.
- Cream together the butter and 11/2 cups sugar in a large bowl.
- Beat in the eggs, one at a time; add the lemon extract.
- Gradually stir in the lemon zest and soured milk.
- Gently fold in the chopped strawberries.
- Mix the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt together in another bowl.
- Stir the butter mixture into the flour mixture until dry ingredients are just moistened.
- Fold in the chocolate chips.
- Spoon batter into prepared muffin cups to about 2/3 full.
- Place a strawberry slice atop each muffin and sprinkle with some of the I tablespoon white sugar.
- Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of a muffin comes out clean, 25 to 30 minutes. Cool in the pans for 5 minutes before serving warm.



CPC Christian Book Club Monday March 1st 10:30 am in the Chapel

Spanning 2,000 miles and traversing six states from Missouri to the Pacific Ocean, the Oregon Trail is the route that made America. In the fifteen years before the Civil War, when 400,000 pioneers used it to emigrate West--historians still regard this as the largest land migration of all time--the trail united the coasts, doubled the size of the country, and laid the groundwork for the railroads. The trail years also solidified the American character: our plucky determination in the face of adversity, our impetuous cycle of financial bubbles and busts, the fractious clash of ethnic populations competing for the same jobs and space. Today, amazingly, the trail is all but forgotten. Rinker Buck is no stranger to grand adventures. "The New Yorker "described his first travel narrative, "Flight of Passage," as "a funny, cocky gem of a book," and with "The Oregon Trail "he seeks to bring the most important road in American history back to life. At once a majestic American journey, a significant work of history, and a personal saga reminiscent of bestsellers by Bill Bryson and Cheryl Strayed, the book tells the story of Buck's 2,000-mile expedition across the plains with tremendous humor and heart. He was accompanied by three cantankerous mules, his boisterous brother, Nick, and an "incurably filthy" Jack Russell terrier named Olive Oyl. Along the way, Buck dodges thunderstorms in Nebraska, chases his runaway mules across miles of Wyoming plains, scouts more than five hundred miles of nearly vanished trail on foot, crosses the Rockies, makes desperate fifty-mile forced marches for water, and repairs so many broken wheels and axels that he nearly reinvents the art of wagon travel itself. Apart from charting his own geographical and emotional adventure, Buck introduces readers to the evangelists, shysters, natives, trailblazers, and everyday dreamers who were among the first of the pioneers to make the journey west. With a rare narrative power, a refreshing candor about his own weakness and mistakes, and an extremely attractive obsession for history and travel, "The Oregon Trail" draws readers into the journey of a lifetime.
