The Work of the Holy Spirit

If we are called by God to holiness of life, and if holiness is beyond our natural power to achieve (which it certainly is) then it follows that God himself must give us the light, the strength, and the courage to fulfill the task he requires of us. He will certainly give us the grace we need. If we do not become saints it is because we do not avail ourselves of his gift. - Thomas Merton

The gift of God for our holiness of life is the Holy Spirit who equips and encourages us to live according to God's call.

During the months of September through December, the topic of our Sunday Sermon Series, supported by our Bible Reading Plan and Daily Devotions, is *The Work of the Holy Spirit*. Together we will explore how the Spirit does his work, both individually through the fruit he grows in us, and corporately as he unites and gifts us as a congregation for ministry.

However, to live lives of holiness takes more than simply reading God's Word and hearing a pastor speak in church. Transformation of life, from living primarily for ourselves to living primarily for God, is a long and often daunting process.

The Japanese children's story teller, Daisaku Ikeda, wrote *The Cherry Tree.* This story, set in post-war Japan, tells of two children who one day stumble upon an old man who is attempting to nurse back to life a barren, aged and war-damaged cherry tree. At first the children are puzzled by the man's devotion to such a tree. When they inquire about this, the old man explains: "It's true she hasn't blossomed since before the war. But one day, with a little kindness and patience, she may again."

The children, inspired by the old man's devotion and hope, agree to join him in his efforts to nurse the tree back to life. They work hard, but much of their time is spent waiting and hoping. And then one day a single pink petal appears, followed in due time by a beautiful display of fruit-producing blossoms.

We may wonder whether our lives will ever produce the kind of spiritual fruit of which the Bible speaks. This simple story reminds us that we are called to devote our lives to nurturing the "tree" of our spiritual life, even when the tree seems not to be actively producing fruit. We must not give up hope that God will do what God has promised to do. As Jesus said: "If you remain in me and I remain in you, you will produce much fruit" (John 15:5).



#### Updating our Church's COVID-19 Plan

In May of this year, the Board of our church approved the following COVID-19 Operational Plan:

1. Wearing a mask is optional in worship and at all church activities. Masks and hand-sanitizer will be available in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall.

2. In Worship, we will serve communion (with a few tweaks to enhance health and safety) and offer Young Disciples' Time. We will continue our practice of not having materials in the pew racks, and we will not pass the offering plate. Offerings can be placed in the Offering Boxes at the rear of the Sanctuary.

3. Fellowship Time after worship will take place in Fellowship Hall with food and beverages offered by masked and gloved servers at the kitchen counter.

At their recent August meeting, the Board decided to continue our current Operational Plan. In addition, some of our ministry programs that normally begin in September will be put "on hold" for the time being, and one-time in-person events will be postponed.

Ministry programs put "on hold" include Wednesday evening MidWeek, Wednesday in the Word, and Women's Association. One-time in-person events being postponed include Memorial Services and in-door congregational gatherings.

We encourage everyone who would like to wear a mask in worship or while participating in a ministry activity to do so; the livestreaming of our worship services will continue.

This Operational Plan complies with the current "Stage 4 of the State of Idaho and Department of Health and Welfare Stay Healthy Guidelines." Should State guidelines change, we will amend our plan accordingly.

#### Moment for Mission

At CongoPres, we believe that mission is not simply something we *do*, but is essential to our identity as disciples of Jesus. We are a family of God that has been given a mission to serve and love the world through the grace of Jesus Christ. One of the ways we fulfill our mission "To Know Christ, To Become Like Christ, To Share Christ" is through supporting and serving local ministries and organizations here in the LC valley and beyond. Below, we want to highlight one of our ministry partners. If you would like to know more about how you can support this organization or others, please reach out to our Board Member for Mission, Dar Wendt, or Pastor McLane.

#### Willow Center

At Willow Center, we are a non-profit, charitable organization, that provides supports groups and resources for children and teens free of charge. Our program is designed to provide a caring, accepting environment that greatly enriches the healing process by allowing children and families to share their grief with others who have had comparable loss.

The support groups at Willow Center are coordinated by behavioral health professionals and trained volunteers and currently meet twice a month - year round. Groups are delineated by age with concurrent support groups available for the adult caregivers/parents of the children that are attending. Upon referral to the center, an intake appointment is scheduled to get information about the child(ren), family, circumstances of the death, and to provide information/details about the program.

We currently serve the Lewis and Clark Valley and surrounding areas, but also have families coming from around the region, including: Pullman, Orofino, Cottonwood, and even as far away as Riggins. Willow Center is the only organization between Boise and Spokane that is dedicated to serving the needs of grieving children, teens and their families in a free of charge, on-going open ended, support group format modeled on best practices and the assumption no two children grieve the same



## Ingredienes:

- I c. white corn syrup
- I c. white sugar
- I c. peanut butter
- I tsp. vanilla
- 6 c. Rice Krispies
- I bag (2 c.) butterscotch chips
- 3/4 bag (1 1/2 c.) milk chocolate chips

## Directions:

- Mix corn syrup and sugar in heavy 2 quart saucepan. Bring to rolling boil, stirring frequently.
- When sugar is dissolved, remove from heat and add peanut butter and vanilla. Stir well until thoroughly combined.
- Pour over Rice Krispies; combine and pour into a IOxI5x1 inch jelly roll pan. With greased hands, press mixture until pan is covered.
- Melt butterscotch and chocolate chips in microwave for I minute on HIGH. Stir. Microwave I more minute, until chips are melted. Stir well and spread on Rice Krispy mixture.
- Cut into small bars and enjoy.
