In his letter to young Timothy, the Apostle Paul says: "Godliness with contentment is great gain" (1 Timothy 6:6). Contentment. What a wonderful word, one that I would like to experience more of in my life. To be content with who God has created me to be. To be content with what God has given me to do. To be content with what God has given me to use. To be content with what I have. How do I increase my level of contentment?

When God created us, he separated us from the rest of his creation by giving us a sense of destiny, a need for meaning in our existence. In so doing, he instilled in us the need to be drawn to something greater than ourselves and the things we can accumulate. Contentment is found in pursuing God's purpose for us.

But human pride wants us to believe that we are the masters of our destiny. God's eternal plan fades as we try to make something of ourselves, to prove our worth, to attain the applause of others. Messages from the media assure us that we can be a little better than we are. Keeping up with the Joneses becomes an obsession. The lie that our homes, our cars, our jobs, our clothes, and even our recreation can provide contentment contradicts God's design for making us truly content.

Jesus once said that my heart will be where my treasure is (Matthew 6:21). He said that it is much more important to store up treasures in heaven than here on earth. What good advice if I want to live with contentment. To store up treasures in heaven rather than on earth means I won't have to worry that my treasures will break or be stolen or destroyed. And heavenly treasures will greet me when I arrive; my stuff on earth will be left behind.

Heavenly treasures are things that last forever. According to the Bible, only two things are eternal: God's Word (Isaiah 40:8) and people (Revelation 22:5). How do I invest in God's Word? By studying it, applying it to my life, teaching it to others, and allowing it to transform my life. How do I invest in people? By loving them, showing Christ to them, helping them in their faith, and encouraging them to allow God to transform their lives.

If you like the idea of storing up heavenly treasures instead of earthly stuff, here are some ideas for your heavenly treasure chest:

- The fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23)
- · People with whom you have shared the good news of Jesus Christ (Mark 16:15)
- · Children you've loved and cared for, and widows you've "adopted" as grandmas (James 1:27)
- · Lives that have been touched by your encouragement (Ephesians 4:29)
- Worn-out, read-through Bibles, full of your own study notes (2 Timothy 2:15)

These are the kinds of treasure that lead to contentment – let's start storing them up.



Yours in Christ, Pastor Steve 2021-2022 marks the 30th year that Congregational Presbyterian Church will be participating in the Angel Tree program of ministering to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of children who have a parent incarcerated in a State or Federal prison. It is the love of Jesus Christ, *that baby in a manger*, that we see reflected through joyful, great-hearted giving on behalf of Angel Tree, the ministry that gives us an opportunity to help meet the needs of families of prisoners.

We again begin our year-long process of connecting parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts. Each child receives two wrapped gifts: one new toy or fun gift, and one new article of clothing, each with a \$25+ value. I hope that we can again take the program one step further by purchasing a gift certificate from a local supermarket or department store for each of the caregivers.

Not only do we bring Christmas gifts to every household, but Sherry Greenup also ministers to each of our Angel Tree families by preparing beautiful food baskets. We will once again follow through in 2022 with Easter Baskets and birthday gifts for our Angel Tree children. We've been notified that Angel Tree is offering a local Camp experience for these children as well this year.

Select an angel sign up and then shop for your gifts.

All wrapped gifts must be returned to the church by Sunday, December 19th, to allow plenty of time for delivery before Christmas.





#### Moment for Mission

At CongoPres, we believe that mission is not simply something we *do*, but is essential to our identity as disciples of Jesus. We are a family of God that has been given a mission to serve and love the world through the grace of Jesus Christ. One of the ways we fulfill our mission "To Know Christ, To Become Like Christ, To Share Christ" is through supporting and serving local ministries and organizations here in the LC valley and beyond. Below, we want to highlight one of our ministry partners. If you would like to know more about how you can support this organization or others, please reach out to our Board Member for Mission, Dar Wendt, or Pastor McLane.

#### Snake River Community Clinic

Snake River Community Clinic is a nonprofit free clinic serving the Lewis-Clark Valley and the outlying areas. The clinic serves individuals and families that do not have insurance, are below 250% of the federal poverty level, have only catastrophic insurance, or are waiting to establish care with a medicaid/medicare provider.

The clinic was founded in the year of 2000 by Glenn E. Jefferson, MD and Stamey English, MD. There was a need in the community for better access to medical care. Together with the help of retired Pharmacist Richard Bognas, the clinic was able to provide free medication to patients. There are numerous community members that have given countless hours as volunteers. They are the heart and the reason for the clinics twenty plus years of operation. Another central figure to the story is former director, Charlotte Ash (and her family). Charlotte was known for her ability to recognize patient's faces and her heart for those in need.

As the torch has been passed to the next generation, led by Director Heidi Burford-Bell, new technologies are being utilized and integrated services offered. The Board of Director's composition includes medical, dental, pharmacy, and public health experts.

Over time the offerings by the clinic have expanded to include lab testing, free hygiene products, over-the-counter medications, limited durable medical equipment, access to free/or reduced cost imaging services, sexually transmitted infections testing and treatment, integrated behavioral health visits, and dental services that go beyond tooth extractions to restorative care.

We believe that to achieve whole body health, primary care must include medical, dental, and mental health care services. When a patient comes through our doors the economic stress of healthcare expenses should be alleviated so the patient can focus on healing and prevention education.

Thanks to the help of professional volunteers, health pathways students, and community donors, this clinic operates 3 days a week for most of the year. It is an absolute privilege to serve in this community by bridging the gap in access to healthcare for the underserved. Together, we build the bridge! We are Snake River Community Clinic!
