

Dear Church Family,

Paul's letter to the Philippian Christians is one of my favorite books in the Bible. Unlike other letters he writes, Paul is not dealing with heresy in the church nor is he writing a tightly woven theological essay. He is writing to people he is proud of, followers of Christ who are doing pretty well. To be sure, Paul does refer to some of the difficulties of the Christian life. Being persecuted for one's faith, for example, is addressed. But, on the whole, the tone of the letter is positive and filled with the joy that Paul feels for the congregation – a joy I echo when I think of our family of faith. One of the interesting characteristics of this joyful and uplifting letter is that Paul wrote it while in prison, awaiting a trial the outcome of which could result in his execution.

In the mid-first century, Philippi was an important city with a rich heritage and distinctive culture, and it is no surprise that Paul chose it as the base for his evangelistic work in the region known as Macedonia (northern Greece). We learn about Paul's first visit to Philippi in the book of Acts. The church he established there included the wealthy merchant Lydia and her household, a jailer and his family, and perhaps an unnamed slave girl. Apparently the group was meeting in Lydia's home. While this was clearly not a homogenous social group, God had called each believer from his or her place in society to be a part of this local group of believers. The Philippian church supported Paul's missionary efforts in other towns and helped him in times of need, even when other churches were either unable or unwilling to assist him.

Affirming the faithful and encouraging our work in Christ is a pastoral responsibility that I enjoy in our congregation. My prayer for our church is from the first chapter of Philippians, verses ten and eleven: "May we understand what really matters, so that we may live pure and blameless lives until Christ returns. May we always be filled with the fruit of our salvation – those good things that are produced in our life by Jesus Christ – for this will bring much glory and praise to God."

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! Here at Union Gospel Mission, we are excited for what God will do in 2023. He is already faithfully at work, continuing to provide for our every need and bringing people together in support of our newest endeavor: the LC Valley's first clean-and-sober shelter.

Those who have chosen to walk alongside us on this journey have been one of our greatest blessings over the past year, and we're eager to move forward, finish funding the project, and pass that blessing along to the hundreds of men, women, and children in need in the greater LC Valley.

Here's where we're at: We have already raised over \$800K of the \$3M we're asking from the Valley. The architectural plans are progressing well, we will soon select our builder, and we have scheduled a full calendar of fundraising and informational events starting in March. Going forward, we will be providing monthly updates so that you don't miss a single step of this exciting journey. I am certain that we will look back on 2023 as a year of profound grace and tremendous teamwork.

Here's what we need from you: 1) Pray for the details: there is a myriad of decisions that will need to be made over the course of the year, and 2) our marketing team has created a brand-new page on our website featuring the LC Valley project (you can find it here: www.uniongospelmission.org/lcvalley). Please share this page with anyone in your circle who might be edified by joining this endeavor. People are finding hope at UGM, and we need your help to prepare a place for those experiencing homelessness, abuse, or addiction in the LC Valley.

Finally, let us rest in the words of the Psalmist: "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain" (Psalm 127:1). The only way ahead is with Him. We prayerfully submit our plans to the Lord and look forward to all that He will do.

TOUCHDOWN!!! GOALS MET!

Thank you to all of you who participated in our recent “Souper Bowl” food drive. Thanks to your generosity, we surpassed our goal of 57 bags. FINAL count was 83 GENEROUS “bags” of food. Food donations were sorted and donated to three wonderful causes: Lewiston and Clarkston school districts for the back pack program and First Christian Church in Clarkston to support the Red Door Kitchen which offers a free meal every day.



The mission committee filled backpacks with essentials such as blanket, socks, gloves, washcloth and hand towel and toiletries and donated to the Juvenile Correction Facility to be given to the young men when released from the facility.



HANDS and FEET: One of the most worthwhile aspects of the mission committee is assisting friends and sisters and brothers in Christ when there is a need. These are typically short term projects such as yard work or moving. We had the privilege of helping a sister in Christ with moving in February; it was apparent that we could use additional help when it comes to “heavy lifting” projects. If this is something you can assist with, and are open to being added to our Hands and Feet group texts and emails, please contact Patti Mann at 208-790-0693.

The mission committee invited Kristin Schmidt from Community Action Partnership to share with us the services this organization offers. Kristin thanked our church family for the monthly support that we currently offer and gave us a brief recap: Community Action Partnership is a non-profit organizations funded across the United States by federal and local governments, and by private donations. Locally, the main office is in Lewiston, but covers the ten northernmost counties in Idaho and Asotin County in Washington. Their goal is to help end poverty and help individuals in the community thrive. She explained there are four departments which are: 1) Weatherization Program which they assess the energy needs for applicants, replace doors, windows, furnace, or weatherize and educate. 2) Housing Program which manages 44 affordable-housing units around the Lewis-Clark valley. 3) Energy Assistance which assists with bills for heating and cooling needs. 4) Community Services such as the Food Bank gives out food boxes. There is a coaching program to help with homelessness, child care, budgeting and mentoring. They partner with the Area Agency on Aging to help with delivery of senior meals, housekeeping, and respite for caregivers, and more. They partner with Interlink to provide rides, contract with Legal Aid to provide legal assistance; offer Adult Protection services to help disabled and vulnerable adults cope and prevent abuse; and they have a residents’ rights advocate for people in care facilities. We are happy to support this valuable resource for our community.







Berlin, six years later. Hanni Winter glows with pride as she shows her new husband around her first solo photography exhibition. But then she sees Freddy's reaction. His face white, he can't take his eyes off a photo of a young girl around four years old. 'That's Renny,' he whispers, 'my sister, she was taken by the Nazis...'

Technical Help for Those Who Live Stream Our Sunday Worship Services

Brad Peer, a member of our congregation, provides the following insights:

The question was asked at the recent annual meeting, “How do I access the church live stream?” The response was to use your web browser to access the church website and click on the live stream link. It was also noted that the previous week’s service could be found there for viewing until the current week’s stream was saved to the Internet.

Back in 2020 when streaming church was the only option, Jana and I began watching the stream on our computer. Viewing the service from our computer did provide us with a way to attend church during the time that group gatherings were prohibited, but it did leave much to be desired. Immediately after that first church streaming experience I began to contemplate what I could do to improve the experience. We tried a few different options including casting the stream from my phone and also from the computer to our TV. Each had some negative aspects and I continued to pursue a better option. Looking closely at the links to the streaming services I noted the small grey link – “Powered by BoxCast.” I followed that link and read much of the content presented and discovered that the streaming could be viewed through the TV using a number of different streaming devices including Roku, which is the device we use for our TV content. It took a couple of attempts and a little back and forth with Pastor McLane to get the settings configured, but now it works nicely. I can watch church on my TV with decent audio while sitting in my comfortable chair at home; a temptation I have succumbed to once or twice. All this to say there are other options to viewing streaming church service.

According to its website: “BoxCast allows its clients to set up Apple TV, Roku, or Fire TV channels. Start by downloading the BoxCast app on those devices and once the app is downloaded, search for your organization.”


Once you have the app installed and have found Congregational-Presbyterian Church, access the “channel.” You will find the next 50 streaming events listed, and the previous 90 days of streaming events all of which are available for viewing.
