Women's Ministry

Dear Church Family,

At the heart of our Christian faith is the story of a man who dies on a cross and on the third day is raised again to life.

The story begins on the evening before the man's death when he gathers with his followers. First, the man reaffirms his love for them. Then, he tells them that the bread and the cup of the meal they are sharing represent his body and blood which will be broken and shed for them, for the forgiveness of their sin.

The story continues with the crucifixion of the man. We struggle with the cross. We prefer the more appealing aspects of following the man - whether it's to a party where he changes water to wine, to a sunlit beach where he preaches from a boat, or to a breezy hillside where he feeds thousands. But to the cross? Who wants to go there? Yet, go we must for it is at the cross that we recognize the price he paid for our sin.

The Good Friday Service in the Sanctuary on Friday, April 7 at 6:00pm helps us come to the cross of Jesus.

Many people believed that the death of the man ended his story. He had apparently failed in his mission and the God he claimed as his Father had seemingly rejected him. They were mistaken! On the third day God raised the man from the dead. God's act restored life to the man, and through the man life will be restored to all who are dead in their sin. Come celebrate God's new life, and invite a friend who may also want to hear the Good News of God's love for them.

BELL CHOIR LOOKING FOR NEW MEMBERS!

The bell choir (called 'Ring Alleluia!') is seeking new members! Thanks to a generous memorial gift four years ago, we have five octaves of bells and hand chimes, but post-COVID we have only enough ringers to regularly play two, maybe three, octaves. It would be wonderful to hear the awesome sound of all of our bells again!

Ringling in a bell choir is a team effort. A set of bells is just one instrument like a piano, one bell is the equivalent of one key. Unlike a piano, it usually takes a team of ringers to be able to play a set of bells—the more bells, the more ringers required. Working together as a team makes ringling fun and builds bonds between us. The end product glorifies God!

Ringling bells in a bell choir is much easier than playing most other instruments. You can learn the basics with a few lessons. It's a plus if you have some knowledge of reading music—note values (e.g., whole, half, quarter), time signatures (e.g., 4/4, 3/4, 2/4), so that you can tell when to ring your bells, but we can teach you if you don't. The goal would be to have someone without any prior experience ringling with us by fall.

All adults and kids in middle or high school are welcome. Younger children should begin with the chime choir, which hopefully will get started again next fall. A serious commitment to coming to practices every week is the main requirement. A bell choir can't play very well with missing team members. Our rehearsal times are on Thursdays from 5:15 pm to 6:15 pm, but we might be able to adjust that. If you like listening to bells, you'd get to hear them every week at practice!

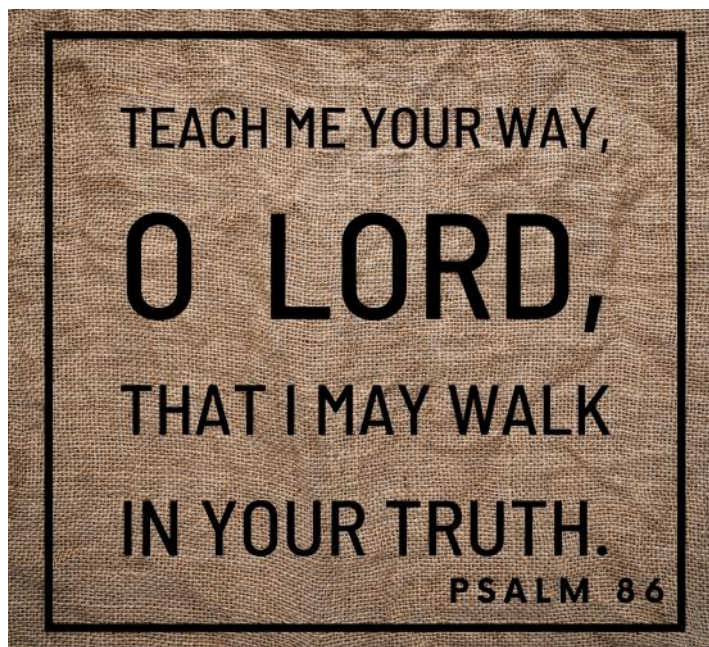

College Scholarship

Application will be taken until May 31, 2023

Through the generosity of former and current members and friends of our congregation, a trust fund has been established for the purpose of furthering educational opportunities for members of our congregation and others who are or have been involved in the life and ministry of our church. The trust fund yields an annual interest which is used by our Congregational-Presbyterian Church Fund Ministry to award scholarships to students. The CPC Fund ministry is excited to announce that the application for our 2023-2024 College Scholarship is now available. The CPC Fund Ministry has set the following guidelines:

1. The recipient must be a member of our congregation or active in the Congregational-Presbyterian Church youth program at the present time, or previously if now in college or going back to school.
2. The award is renewable annually *upon application*, for a maximum of four years, toward certification or an associate, bachelor or graduate degree.
3. Awards will be granted to:
 - *Those graduating from high school and going on to college
 - *Current undergraduate and graduate students
 - *Those in vocational training
 - *Those in career changes

NEW LED LIGHTING FOR FELLOWSHIP HALL

Rich Goodwin, Facilities Manager, reported that on March 21, 2023 Flerchinger Electric replaced all the florescent lights in Fellowship Hall, kitchen area, and restrooms with LED tubes. This will result in a 75% saving in electrical usage for the most utilized building at Congregational-Presbyterian Church. Avista Utilities provided a rebate to help with the cost of the retrofit. Additionally, three new exit sign were replaced with emergency lights connected to provide lighting when the power goes out.

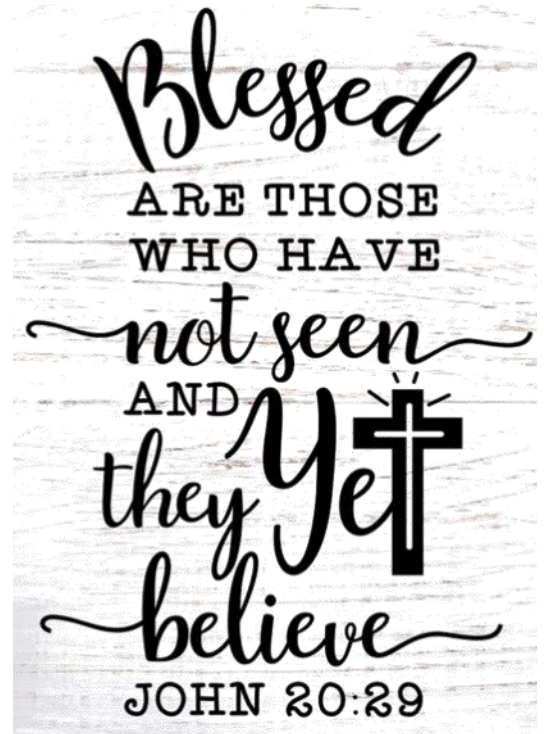

One of the community organizations our church family supports is INTERLINK. Loren Beauchamp from INTERLINK recently visited the mission committee to provide an update on their organization. The mission of Interlink is "Providing volunteers to enable the elderly and disabled to live independently in their own homes." Various services include coordinating in-town transportation to medical appointments, shopping or recreational events; grocery pick-up and delivery; in-home assistance such as light-bulb replacement and installation of grab bars to reduce risk of falls; and construction of ADA access ramps.

This is a very important service to individuals who do not have family members available to help them as ongoing needs arise. Loren expressed the many benefits their volunteers experience in sharing their time in service to others. During the pandemic, many volunteers quit; therefore, they currently have an urgent need for volunteers and are earnestly seeking our help to get the message out.

If you are interested in volunteering (any amount of time is appreciated), contact Interlink directly at 509-751-9143. They will provide appropriate training to all volunteers. Additionally volunteer drivers may be reimbursed at 62.5 cents per mile for 2023.
