Dear Church Family,

These past several months we have tried something new as congregation on Sunday mornings. On the first Sunday of each month, beginning in January, we have offered one Combined Service at 10:00am which has, on those mornings, replaced our regular 9:00am Contemporary Service and 11:00am Traditional Service. Combining worshipers from the two services, our worship style has been a blend of our regular service styles.

The feedback from the congregation has been very positive. The most common response has been the enjoyment of worshipping with members of the "other" service, having the opportunity to better to get to know them during the greeting time during worship as well as the fellowship time after worship. Another observation has been the pleasure of the increased number of worshippers in the Sanctuary, wherein the singing and other forms of congregational participation take on an added vibrancy simply by having more people participating. Of course, it is harder getting around the Sanctuary during the greeting time to see friends and meet new people, with the aisles more crowded, but everyone seems to be getting along just fine.

On these Combined Sundays, we have heard from various members of our church family share spiritual insights from their personal faith journeys. These messages have been well received, with many reflecting on how much what was shared spoke to their own, personal situations. For myself, it gives me a Sunday "off" from preparing and giving the message, a nice monthly break which serves to refresh me for the rest of the month.

Given this positive reaction to the Combined Service, our Board in April decided to extend our current worship format through the month of September. As we are prayerfully hopeful of having a new pastor on board in September, the Board felt it appropriate to reevaluate our worship format with the input of the new pastor at that time.

There was some discussion at the Board meeting of extending the Combined Service Sunday to other Sundays of the month, but the value of providing a diversity of styles in Worship by offering two services was determined to be still a vital aspect of our worship as a congregation.

As we continue to worship the Lord, through Sunday gatherings and throughout the week individually and in smaller groups, let us remember to pray for His guidance of our Pastor Search Committee. They meet regularly to discuss pastoral resumes, review candidate sermons, and engage selected applicants in video conversations. We look forward with great anticipation for the person to be revealed whom the head of our church, Jesus Christ, has chosen for us.

A Beacon of HOPE

The Lewis Clark Valley's first clean-and-sober shelter will break ground by the end of the summer, 2023! The Union Gospel Mission (UGM) is answering God's call in Matthew 25 and seeks to make a difference for our brothers and sisters whose lives are damaged by trauma, abuse, addiction, mental illness, or neglect. Their program brings healing into an environment conducive to change, not just through food and shelter. The overall program includes Rescue, Recovery and Restoration. These programs have been ongoing in the Spokane and Coeur d'Alene area since the first shelter opened in Spokane in 1951. The Rescue program addresses homelessness, family breakdown and addiction and this will be the emphasis of the new Mission in the LC Valley. You can view more about this mission online at uniongospelmission.org/lcvalley.

The facility has a projected cost of \$7 million and like all UGM activities, functions totally on private donations, not government funding. \$4 million has already been pledged by the Union Gospel Mission Foundation in Spokane! Of the \$3 million requested of the LC Valley, \$2 million still needs to be committed. There are many ways to donate if God is calling you to serve those in need through this ministry.

What's Cooking at CPC

Cinnamon Roll Breakfast Casserole



Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 25 minutes Total Time: 30-35 minutes

Yield: 12

2 tubes 5 count each, Pillsbury Grands Cinnamon Rolls

8 oz. cream cheese, cubed

3/4 cup milk

6 eggs

I tsp. cinnamon

1/3 cup maple syrup

I Tosp. Vanilla

- *Open the cans of cinnamon rolls and cut each roll into 8 pieces (save the icing that comes in the package for use later in step 5). Lay the rolls in a 9 X l3 inch baking dish that has been sprayed with non-stick cooking spray.
- *Slice the cream cheese into small cubed pieces and tuck in between the cinnamon roll pieces.
- *In a bowl, combine the eggs, milk, cinnamon, syrup, and vanilla. Pour over the cinnamon rolls making sure everything is covered. At this point you can either bake it or put it in the refrigerator to bake later in the day or the next morning.
- *Bake in a 350-degree oven for about 30 to 35 minutes or until the rolls are puffed up in the middle and slightly browned. The egg mixture should be set and not gooey. Cut into 12 servings.
- *In a microwave safe bowl, heat the icing that came with the cinnamon rolls in the microwave for a few seconds. Drizzle over the casserole.
- *Serve warm and enjoy!
- *Optional topping ideas: fresh fruit, nuts, whipped cream, powdered sugar.

College Scholarship

Application will be taken until May 31, 2023

Through the generosity of former and current members and friends of our congregation, a trust fund has been established for the purpose of furthering educational opportunities for members of our congregation and others who are or have been involved in the life and ministry of our church. The trust fund yields an annual interest which is used by our Congregational-Presbyterian Church Fund Ministry to award scholarships to students. The CPC Fund ministry is excited to announce that the application for our 2023-2024 College Scholarship is now available. The CPC Fund Ministry has set the following guidelines:

- 1. The recipient must be a member of our congregation or active in the Congregational-Presbyterian Church youth Program at the Present time, or Previously if now in college or going back to school.
- 2. The award is renewable annually *upon application*, for a maximum of four years, toward certification or an associate, bachelor or gradu ate degree.
- 3. Awards will be granted to:
 - *Those graduating from high school and going on to college
 - *Current undergraduate and graduate students
 - *Those in vocational training
 - *Those in career changes



Woodrow Wilson Nickel, age 105, feels his life ebbing away. But when he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling the unforgettable experience he cannot take to his grave.

It's 1938. The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in two giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing the Atlantic. What follows is a twelve-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San Diego Zoo. Behind the wheel is the young Dust Bowl rowdy Woodrow. Inspired by true events, the tale weaves real-life figures with fictional ones, including the world's first female zoo director, a crusty old man with a past, a young female photographer with a secret, and assorted reprobates as spotty as the giraffes.

Part adventure, part historical saga, and part coming-of-age love story, West with Giraffes explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, the passing of time, and a story told before it's too late.
