Friends,

My prayers are with you as we begin this season of Lent. Lent is those 40 days where Jesus was in the wilderness in preparation for his ministry and its ultimate end. In this season we focus on things like repentance and doing or being different in order to grow spiritually. This is a spiritual way of marking time and our calendars, so that we are in tune with the seasons of God, and not just our clocks and calendars. This kind of marking time is a spiritual practice.

Between now and Holy Week, we're going to look at, hear about, and maybe even experiment with different kinds of spiritual practices. Maybe you've heard them called spiritual disciplines or exercises. These are different names for the same thing. It is a kind of effort, discipline, exercise, practice, training or whatever you'd like to call it in order to place ourselves before God. Sometimes there are inner practices, like silence or meditation on scripture. Sometimes there are more outward-looking practices like "giving something up", or serving others in a new way.

Maybe these kinds of works and practices bring up a past tradition you were a part of, or it feels legalistic. I see these as life-giving practices not as things we *have* to do, or we *must* do, of even *should* do, but as ways that we get to do that are ultimately good for our spirits, and our connection to God. On Sundays, we'll hear sermons on different practices and where they're found in scripture, and on Wednesday evenings, we'll go deeper or look at different practices. On Wednesdays we'd love you to join us for this time of study in community, with a meal at 5:30. All are welcome, and if you're not available for the meal, we'd still love to have you join us from 6:00-7:00 as we look deeper into these practices.

In this time of repentance and reflection, if this feels like you, and you want to talk about these in a conversation, I'm here for you. Call the office, drop by, or let's meet up for coffee, or a walk as the weather gets warmer. If you'd like to meet up, my email is <u>adamo@congopres.org</u>. I'm excited to hear form you. Grace and peace to you in this Lenten seaon.



10:00am Combined Worship




SMALL GROUPS

College Scholarship

Application will be taken until May 31, 2023

Through the generosity of former and current members and friends of our congregation, a trust fund has been established for the purpose of furthering educational opportunities for members of our congregation and others who are or have been involved in the life and ministry of our church. The trust fund yields an annual interest which is used by our Congregational-Presbyterian Church Fund Ministry to award scholarships to students. The CPC Fund ministry is excited to announce that the application for our 2023-2024 College Scholarship is now available. The CPC Fund Ministry has set the following guidelines:

I. The recipient must be a member of our congregation or active in the Congregational-Presbyterian Church youth program at the present time, or previously if now in college or going back to school.

2. The award is renewable annually *upon application*, for a maximum of four years, toward certification or an associate, bachelor or graduate degree.

- 3. Awards will be granted to:
 - *Those graduating from high school and going on to college
 - *Current undergraduate and graduate students
 - *Those in vocational training
 - *Those in career changes

DIANE ASHBURN WILMONEN SCHOLARSHIP

"God is using me to tell others about Jesus," Diane said of her 7-year journey with breast cancer. In August, 2002, family and friends celebrated the life of Diane at the Congregational-Presbyterian Church.

Diane studied vocal training for 3 years at Washington State University. She graduated from LCSC and became a devoted music teacher in the Lewiston Schools. While in college she was listed in "Who's Who Among American Universities and Colleges," National Dean's List, Ambassadors Honor Society, and was nominated Outstanding Student.

Not only did she participate in choir, band, orchestra, vocal solos during high school and college, she held the lead in musical operas. She spent several years as a member of the Madrigal Singers, Chamber Singers, Sweet Adelines and Washington-Idaho Symphony Chorus. She had a voice like an angel and a passion that touched the hearts of children.

Diane graduated from Lewiston High School in 1967 and married Kenneth Wilmonen. She and Ken had two sons, Robert and Scott.

Diane always remained faithful to God. She is remembered as being compassionate, conscientious and dedicated. She worshiped and was active in the Congregational-Presbyterian Church her entire life where she sang in the choir for 30 years. Diane was always strongly committed to her God and her church. We gratefully award this scholarship in her memory.

This is a \$1,200 scholarship, given annually, with \$600 awarded each semester.

USE OF SCHOLARSHIP:

*This scholarship will be granted to a *first time or returning* college student who will be enrolled full time for the fall semester.

*The student must use the funds for related college expenses. Student may incur liability for any amount applied to room and board.

*The date of the distribution of funds will be at the discretion of the Lewiston Independent Foundation for Education (L.I.F.E.) which administers these funds.


*If the recipient is unable to accept this scholarship on these terms, an alternate may be selected.

ELIGIBILITY:

Must be a full-time student the fall semester after receiving the award, and be a member or friend of the Congregational-Presbyterian Church of Lewiston, Idaho. Previous recipients of the scholarship are not eligible to re-apply.

SELECTION:

The selection committee will consist of the Chairperson of the CPC Fund Ministry of the Congregational-Presbyterian Church, the senior or youth pastor, and a member of the Ashburn family if available.
