Pastor's Letter

As we head into July, let me reference a little science-fiction novel *Psalm for the Wild-Built*, by Becky Chambers. It's a thoughtful meditation on humanity's connection to the land, and it's about this monk named Dix (it's a made-up world, so it's more like Buddhist monk than a monk in the Christian tradition), and this monk meets a robot, and they wander around having discussions about life and humanity. And throughout the story, this one line shows up: "Without constructs, you will unravel few mysteries. Without knowledge of the mysteries, your constructs will fail."

I find this thought (from an author who I don't think has any faith commitments) to be completely delightful. Because as a pastor and as a Christian, that's where I work, and that's where we all live. We have constructs- worship, scripture, traditions, ways of prayer, rhythms of gathering- and we have mysteries - God becoming human, the Holy Spirit's movement in our lives, what happens in prayer. And I'm thinking about that line this month because in the month of July, we're going to celebrate communion every Sunday. And Communion has a construct-by "construct" I just mean how exactly Congo-Pres celebrates it- and it's also amazing because it's where we encounter a mystery. The elder for worship will put out bread, I will once again say "this is my body, this is my blood", you will come up and receive some bread and some juice, and return to your seat. And yet, the sacrament is a mystery. Some bread and juice communicate God's grace. Jesus says "this is my body and blood". Communion isn't just reenactment. It does something mysterious. We encounter death and resurrection, we experience God, we take part in something that unites followers of Jesus around the world (and throughout time, depending on who you ask!) John Calvin put it that the Spirit feeds our souls as the food feeds our bodies. Again, mysteries abound. And mysteries are not that we can't figure something out, but that we're endlessly figuring it out, every time we partake, and maybe what we thought we knew becomes clouded, or maybe God becomes brighter.

We have this format, this construct, and we have these mysteries that we're still unraveling, and how great it is that God invites us all to the table to receive Christ.





In this truly inspirational memoir, Anita Moorjani relates how, after fighting cancer for almost four years, her body began shutting down--overwhelmed by the malignant cells spreading throughout her system. As her organs failed, she entered into an extraordinary near-death experience where she realized her inherent worth . . . and the actual cause of her disease. Upon regaining consciousness, Anita found that her condition had improved so rapidly that she was released from the hospital within weeks--without a trace of cancer in her body!

Within these pages, Anita recounts stories of her childhood in Hong Kong, her challenge to establish her career and find true love, as well as how she eventually ended up in that hospital bed where she defied all medical knowledge. As part of a traditional Hindu family residing in a largely Chinese and British society, Anita had been pushed and pulled by cultural and religious customs since she was a little girl. After years of struggling to forge her own path while trying to meet everyone else's expectations, she had the realization, as a result of her epiphany on the other side, that she had the power to heal herself . . . and that there are miracles in the Universe that she'd never even imagined.

In Dying to Be Me, Anita freely shares all she has learned about illness, healing, fear, "being love," and the true magnificence of each and every human being! This is a book that definitely makes the case that we are spiritual beings having a human experience . . . and that we are all One!



Those receiving scholarships this year are: Lane Riggs majoring in Music Education at the University of Idaho; Jasmine Schmidt majoring in Theology at Whitworth University; Wilson Sheppard majoring in Architecture at the University of Idaho; Julia Williams majoring in Nursing at LCSC; Rachel Sheppard majoring in Biology at Gonzaga University; and Noah Williams majoring in Jazz performance and Business at Arizona State University. One of the questions on the scholarship application is "Tell us about your relationship with the Lord throughout the past year". Following is a sampling of the answer to this question:

"... The verse (Jeremiah 29:11) gives me strength to trust that God has crafted me to do something beautiful as part of His plan. That God, despite the pain I have felt this year, has plans that will not harm me. It gives me the strength to Know that my God is the same God He was when I knew Him at four years old... the same god I knew at eleven years old... the same God that I trust to lead me in being a student minister on campus next year."

"... I have seen the power of God and how he works through everyone... Moving forward, I take my next steps in life with God, and I can't wait to see what's in store."

"...the Jesus I have gotten to know better has made it clear to me that for the Christian person, there is no aspect of life that is not touched by the Spirit. I feel now more than ever that embodying Jesus in our day-to-day life is essential to showing the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth..."

CADENCE INTERNATIONAL: Mission committee members met with a delightful couple Dwight and Letty Grismore to hear about there ministry: CADENCE International which is all about sharing the gospel and lives with the military community. The Grismores shared their story and the path that led them to establish a hospitality house near the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. Hospitality houses are set up near military installations, where military personnel and their families find a welcoming smile, a comfortable couch, a home-cooked meal, and people who listen, love, and guide them to Christ. For many, the hospitality house is a home like they've never experienced and a model for what theirs could be. For others, it's a life changing, course altering experience that positively affects their leadership and service the rest of their lives. Ministry at a hospitality house usually includes Bible studies, worship, shared meals, outreach, discipleship, mission trips, excursions, and various activities designed to grow a healthy Christ-centered community. You can learn about their journey and this non-profit organization at Cadence.org/Grismore. The Grismores know how powerful prayers are and request that we pray for them and this ministry.

Another organization the mission committee believes many in our congregation may be interested in is OLIVE & COOP. The best way to explain is from an excerpt on their website: "At Olive & Coop, we know aging alone can be a challenge. Based on our experience caring for our own parents, we created a novel house-sharing solution that connects older homeowners who want to age safely with conscientious renters willing to help around the home in exchange for lower rent. The benefits of Olive & Coop include assistance with household chores/tasks, additional monthly income, increased safety and social interaction. In addition, conscientious home sharers find more affordable living solutions. It is a practical and financially-wise living arrangement that enriches the lives of both homeowners and home sharers.
